

ANNEXURE C

SAQCC (Corrosion Protection) Procedure Guides

PAINT APPLICATORS COURSE

Annexure C should be read in conjunction with Annexure B describing the cost and fee structures for both local South African courses as well as International courses that may require the use of interpreters and foreign languages.

All Service Providers requesting an examiner will communicate the following criteria to the SAQCC (Corrosion Protection) secretary on requesting an examiner for their course/s irrespective of the country they will be running their course in.

- a) Country where course will be held.
- b) The language in which the students are fluent.
- c) The language in which the course will be presented.
 - i. If not presented in English the Service Provider/Client shall provide an interpreter for the duration of the course.
- d) The language in which the students will be examined.
 - i. If not English preferably the SAQCC examiner needs to be fluent in the foreign language and conversant with the subject matter.
 - ii. If an examiner in the foreign language is not available then a SAQCC appointed examiner and or interpreter shall be used. The same interpreter may not be used for both the course and examination.
- e) The theory shall be a written exam. The practical shall be a combination of both written and oral.
- f) For the oral practical exam, the number of Foreign Language students that can be practically examined per day, is limited to five.
 - i. In the event that the Foreign Language examination and or interpreting takes longer than anticipated, the client shall be required to pay for the extra time.

EXAMINATIONS:

In the event that SAQCC (Corrosion Protection) training is presented in a foreign language, all students shall have a basic knowledge of and ability to understand basic instructions in that language, the following will apply:

- a) The SAQCC (Corrosion Protection) requires that the lecturer speaks the foreign language and if not, can make use of an interpreter.
- b) The SAQCC (Corrosion Protection) requires that the exam be translated and written in a foreign language and shall be examined in the foreign language.
- c) Examination can only take place if multiple Foreign Language Paint Data Sheets and Material Safety Data Sheets, in the said language, are available.

On successful completion of course and exam a SAQCC certificate will be issued to the student.

In accordance with the requirements of the SAQCC syllabus for Paint Applicators, the CLIENT, who sends the students for training, must be aware of the following requirements.

The planned duration is a 5 day course with the exam on the 6th day - 40hrs training.

1.0 PRE-REQUISITES FOR STUDENTS

- Basic knowledge of English.
- Ability to understand basic instructions in English.
- ABET level 2 Literacy or 4 years equivalent schooling.

2.0 RECOMMENDED MINIMUM LEVEL OF PRACTICAL EXPERIENCE

- The candidate must be currently employed in a painting position for a period of 6 months, and must therefore have a minimum level of prior paint experience.
